## Flight of Fancy Exhibition



Retro Aviation has re-used the rear fuselage and tail section of BAe 146-200, G-TBIC, as part of an art exhibition at Tatton Park near Manchester. The location is underneath the flight path for aircraft at the airport, so it will no doubt raise the eyebrows of passengers and crew on their way overhead. Tatton Park's Biennial Flights of Fancy art exhibition opened on May 11 and Retro Aviation was able to supply and install the aircraft for Juneau Projects as a basis for its piece 'Cleaners of the Infocalypse' - intended to represent a wildlife artist's studio and 'hide' in the aftermath of a technology-driven disaster.
